



















Pirate Pancakes

These easy to make Pirate Pancakes might make you start talking like a Pirate!

INGREDIENTS:

- Your favorite pancake mix
- Strawberries
- Bananas
- Mini-chocolate chips
- Chocolate Chips
- Chocolate wafer cookies

DIRECTIONS:

Step 1: Mix up your pancake mix and pour into large ovals on a warm (not hot) griddle that has been sprayed or wiped with oil. I always use a warm griddle when I am making fun pancakes because otherwise they will turn brown too quickly and it is hard to see the different features.

Step 2: Slice the strawberries and arrange onto the pancake in the shape of a bandanna.

Step 3: Split one of the chocolate wafer cookies in half to use for the eye patch. Arrange the mini-chocolate chips for the tie that holds it on.

Step 4: : Slice a banana for the eye and add the chocolate chip. Add one more chocolate chip for the nose.

Step 5: Cut one more strawberry into a mouth and you have a scurvy pirate.













Pool Noodle Swords

These pool noodle swords are perfect for a Pirate war without hurting each other!

MATERIALS:

Pool Noodles

Duct Tape Silver and Black

Scissors

Utility Knife



DIRECTIONS:

STEP 1: Cut the pool noodles in half or to the length that you want.

STEP 2: Wrap one color duct tape around the ends of the pool noodle. Wrap strips of the other color over the top of the duct tape to create a handle.

Geocaching

Geocaching is the ultimate treasure hunt for kids! Using your cell phone or other handheld GPS devices, you can find hidden "caches" in your neighborhood and surrounding areas.

Most caches are tupperware containers with a log book to sign saying you were there. Some of them include little trinkets that you can trade with something you brought.

HOW TO GO GEOCACHING WITH KIDS:

STEP 1: Visit geocaching.com where you will find over 2 million caches and it will specifically tell you how many caches are in your area.

STEP 2: Make sure the kids are dressed comfortably and with good shoes on. Some caches are near the road and some require walking for awhile.

STEP 3: Look at the rating system and find those listed as 1 star if you have small children with you.

STEP 4: Also look for the size of the cache. Larger caches tend to have trinkets to exchange if that is important to your children.

STEP 5: Then follow your GPS to find the cache. The easiest way to do this is by downloading the Geocaching app from the App store.

HOW TO FIND A CACHE

- Follow your coordinates until you are within 20 feet
- Once you are close, just start looking around since a GPS is only accurate to within a few feet
- Take a pole, stick, etc to help you look in enclosed areas.
- Look for branches, piles of sticks or anything else that seems out of the ordinary.



YOU FIND ONE?

- Exchange any trinkets found with something of better value
- Leave your name on the log book
- Put it back where you found it!
